SPIRITUAL

Our faith in God and the desire to see lives transformed by the love of Jesus is the motivation for all we do. In 2025 alone, more than 7,845 people heard the gospel, 200 Bibles were given to new believers, and 150 Sunday School teachers received training to continue sharing His love.



HEALTH

Five medical outreaches served over 31,258 patients at monthly mobile clinics in seven communities. Mission trips united 32 US team members and 116 Kenyan volunteers, providing medical care to 3,125 patients and reaching 4,844 children through children's ministry in four communities. Ten churches in Kiatine received community water tanks, bringing clean water to thousands in need.



EDUCATION

153 high school students, 20 university freshmen, and 5 trade school attendees received sponsorships, and our youth empowerment program (TUYEP) graduated 50 students across two cohorts. The annual student leadership conference was held where 152 sponsored students came together for a weekend of faith, growth, and transformation. Parent seminars engaged 384 parents across all partner communities. The Sports Evangelism President's Cup competition hosted 786 participants.

The new Ndumberi Children's Community Center was completed and celebrated with a grand opening celebration in October. Two Mustard Seeds Boutique found its permanent home in Meridian, Idaho with proceeds supporting high school sponsorships.



ECONOMIC

Over 500 people attended farming and economic development training to build stronger, more self-sustainable communities. Attendee's farms in Kasten and Subukia led to record harvests. Loitokitok repaired vital water systems and launched a goat-tending program for 57 women. New land was purchased in Kasten for future community growth.
