HEALTHCARE

In Bahati, travel nurses visited twice a month to see a record number of patients - 1,987 - in two new rooms built to manage the increase.

The Mercy Medical Clinic in Magumu served 6,167 patients, while the Subukia clinic saw 559 maternity patients and an additional 9,477 patients.

At the small clinic in Kiatine, 1,622 patients were served, and 410 people gained access to water in Kasten.

In 2023, our two medical mission outreaches, 40 people from the US served alongside 94 Kenyan volunteers, providing healthcare services to 2,356 patients in four communities.



Construction of the Ndumberi Children's Community Center continued and is scheduled to open in the fall of 2024.

This year, 14 high school graduates have been accepted to begin university courses in 2024.

In addition to sponsoring 169 high school students across seven communities, we granted scholarships to ten more students in Kiatine.

Our TUYEP program accepted 42 students this year. After completing the program, 17 students moved into job training, and by the end of the year, nine of them had found employment. Community leaders, and local politicians were present to congratulate these hard-working students at graduation.

In the spring, 150 high school students attended our annual Student Leadership Conference, where nine students accepted Jesus into their lives.



ECONOMICS

Two interns were trained for six months alongside our Kenyan office staff, which also included two new hires.

The Kasten farming pilot project was a great success, with a total of 45 farmers from the community participating in our training program. We implemented the distribution of certified seeds and new planting practices, which resulted in harvests that surpassed those of previous years.

We expect increased participation in the program in the future, leading to improved food security for 19 communities in the region.


